On completion it will allow you to more understand how Blogging links in with WordPress.

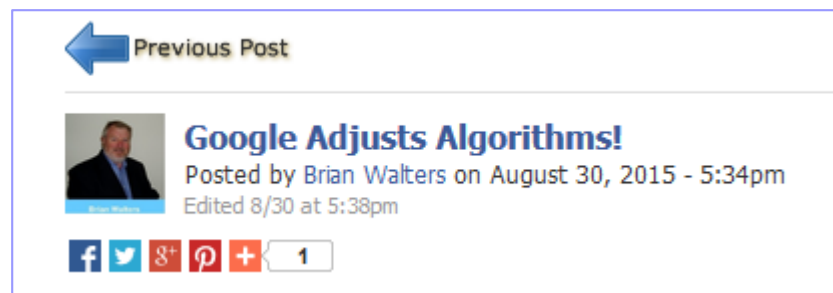
- ***Training's outcomes -***

- – Install the Market Hive Widget
- – View your content and results to make sure the posts and content are all OK.



Install WordPress onto your Domain.

Before the Market Hive WordPress plugin you could share your posts.
Open your Blog Post and below the Blog Topic the icons below become visible



By clicking on these icons or share buttons here your Blog Article is posted on the selected social Network.

The essentials of the Market Hive WordPress Plugin

Note that the WordPress Plugin acts as an additional content system to your main site.

- The Plugin, so to speak “moves” your blog posts in Market Hive to the outside world to your domain and delivers more power and control to your posts.
- So now your blog posts within MarketHive become available to the public via your Domain. That's the whole idea of writing content for a blog.
- The WordPress plugin allows you to create blog posts on your WordPress site, as if you created those posts yourself on your site.
- Using this system, you can create a mix of content from other members (including groups).
- This is powerful because your domain containing the posts is now been put into the traditional “Search Engine Arena” whereas - prior to the WordPress Plugin your content was maybe just in the social arena.

Install WordPress onto your Domain.

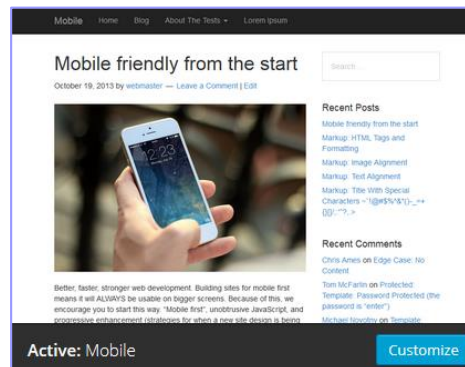
The essentials of the Market Hive WordPress Plugin

Initial setup of WordPress

- Install WordPress from your Domain From your Hosting Account







- Select a theme with a sidebar. This will allow you to display the Market Hive Widget. Say use the "Mobile" theme.



Configure your Market Hive WordPress Plugin.

Select a Plugin ▼ Configure Download Delete Plugin Create New

Select "Create New" or Select an existing Plugin from the list box

Enter Plugin name for admin purposes only

Enter your domain URL. You can use folders and subdomains

Enter your WP title using you sites keywords

Enter your Post category

Enter your blog username, blog sharing names

Select the Number of Posts you want to display.

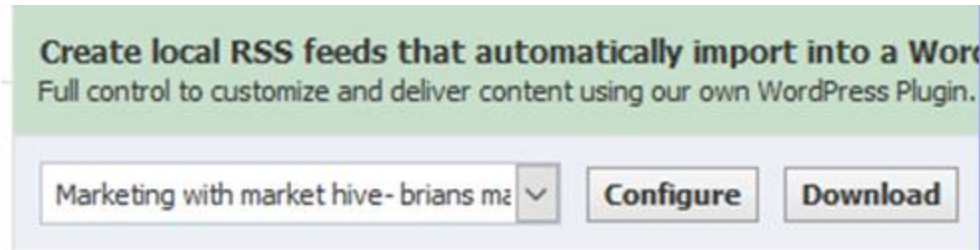

This plugin will be saved into your Windows Download folder by default

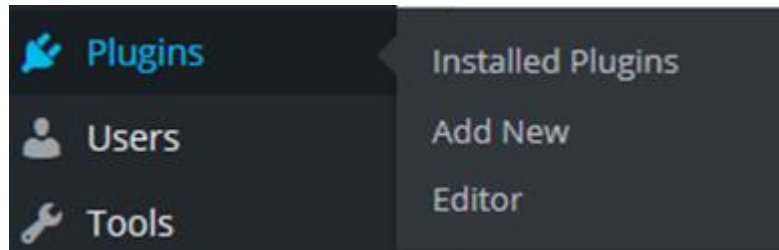
Note:

The zip file which is the plugin file has a specific name. Do not alter the name nomenclature otherwise the file may not install in WordPress properly.

“your MarketHive username”-markethivewordpressplugin.zip

The quotes used above are to illustrate the file name here. Do not alter the file name in any way

Upload your Market Hive plugin.



From the Plugins (as part of the WordPress Dashboard) select **Plugins – Add New**

And Upload the Plugin from the “download folder” on your PC or where ever you stored the file


There are 2 ways to import the Posts from Markethive.

The posts are regenerated twice a day.

One way to “activate the Posts manually” (you only need to do this once) is to create a “Page” containing the short code [mhfeedimport]

This Page should not be part of your menu system, but rather some page only you know and you simply load in your browser.

In your Browser enter the rebuild page: - <http://mysite.com/rebuild/>


The second way to generate your Post Pages:

IS go to the Markethive Settings Page and use the “Import Post Now” button. You normally need to do this once ever.

On the other hand – say you changed links or content in some way of some posts and you need to reload them!

You can delete all the posts in the WordPress Posts area. This actions removes all the posts, both correct and otherwise. Also delete from trash before using the post function again.

AND NOW Important “Empty the Trash Before using the import function again.”






Placing Blog Posts In Your Menu System

Here are the steps to have your Posts appearing on a separate page

Make a new page. It needs no content but just a Page Name say “/markethive-rss-feed.”


Next - Save this page.


